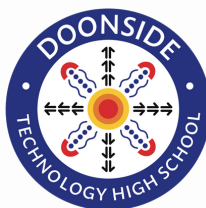

Visual Arts Program and Doonside's First Art Camp

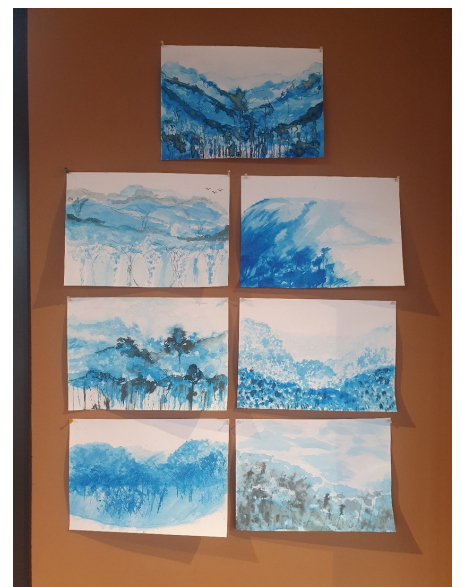
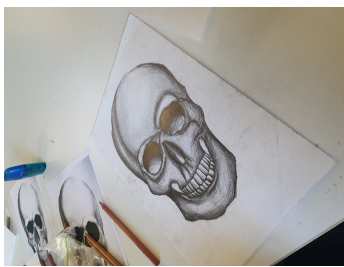
This year selected students from Years 8, 9, and 10 were chosen to be a part of a High Potential Art Program that targeted students who had demonstrated a particular love, passion, and potential in the Visual Arts. This program was funded and supported by the Minister's Art Grant which Miss Saywell applied for and the school received at the beginning of the year. Students in the program have engaged in fortnightly 2-hour lessons where they were taught a range of skills and techniques using a wide array of materials and media. The targeted program has seen students create works across a variety of themes and styles, while also having the opportunity to be supported on a 1 on 1 basis by the program coordinator. The work coming out of this program is incredibly exciting, and we cannot wait to show you more of it in 2023.

In Term 4, the students were provided with an opportunity to attend the school's first Art Camp, held at Bundanon Gallery, Illaroo, located on land once owned by the late Australian artist, Arthur Boyd. The camp was funded by the Art Grant and would not have ever been possible without it. Of the 10 students who attended the camp, 9 had never been on a Highschool camp, their elation, motivation, and engagement during camp expressed their gratitude for the opportunity that the grant provided them. While on camp students created works inspired by the beautiful landscape of the Wodi-Wodi tribe of the Yuin nation, they developed skills in charcoal drawing, painting and watercolor mark making. They also came across native wildlife including 2 red-belly black snakes, a wombat, a goanna and some cheeky mosquitoes! The feedback from students reflects the unprecedented impact of the camp on the student's skills, confidence, and sense of connection.

The work that has been produced over the course of the year, and at camp will be displayed next year in an exhibition at the school. The works will also form a basis for fundraising initiatives such as calendars and gift cards, in the hopes of elevating Visual Arts opportunities for other students. In very exciting news, due to the success of the HPGE Art Program and the first Visual Arts camp, the philanthropy team at the Bundanon Gallery has committed to donating funds that will see 20 students attend the camp in 2023, 2024 and 2025, with the camp fees fully covered along with transportation to and from Illaroo. This generosity and commitment to our students will ensure that the transformative power of art continues to impact students at our school for years to come.

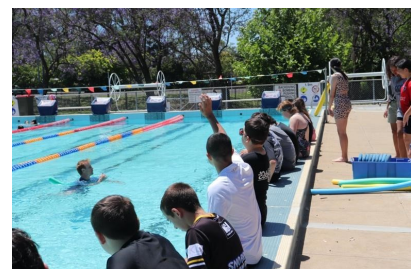
Year 7 PDHPE

Whats been happening in CAPA

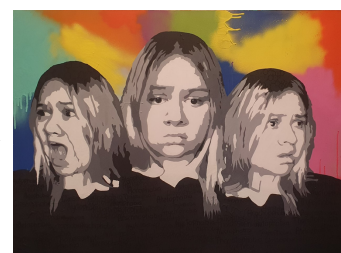

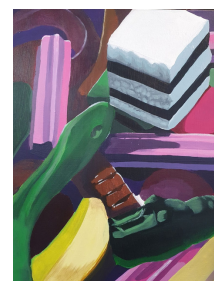

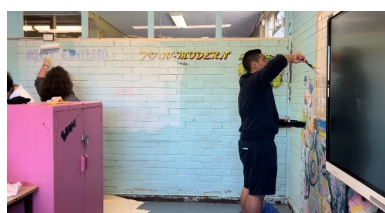
Whats been happening in CAPA

The Art Gallery of NSW has expanded and before the official opening on 3rd December DTHS and 50 selected schools were invited to have a sneak preview. Before we entered the glass entry we passed through a 'smoking' ceremony by elders of the Indigenous community, to the new Sydney Modern gallery. On the first level is the new Yiribana space highlighting the Indigenous artworks of Australia. Students enjoyed exploring this space with large installation works as well more traditional pieces. The new building is over four levels with an outside courtyard overlooking Woolamalo. We then explored the new learning area on level two that had a giant table set up in which each of us took a small handful of clay that we rolled in our hands while meditating. Lunch was provided for us by the Art Gallery of NSW and was held in the outside courtyard up on the rooftop. Then to the 'Tank' an exhibition space which originally was an oil tank for the Naval base at Garden Island, amazing. Then back up to level three to see the 'Dream House' exhibition that is exhibiting the house sculptures that Yr7 made, that are now part of the Alfredo and Isabel Aquilizan installation. "I want to say to the staff, students and off of the community- I will miss you. I'll miss my kids and their families. I've been here for over 28 years. I knew their parents and even some of their grandparents. I wish them the best for the future. I just want them to enjoy life and always respect people. Tell them- to be true to yourself- lying only hurts you."

To the staff she added a thank you *"they always made me feel like I have had a place to belong."*

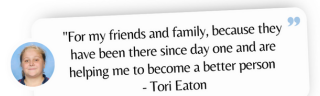
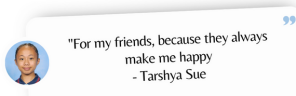
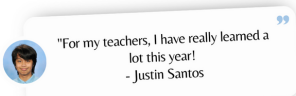
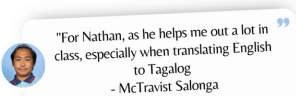
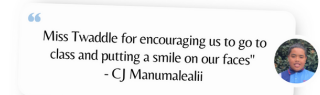
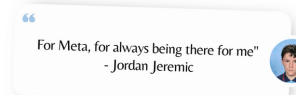
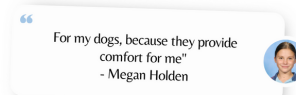
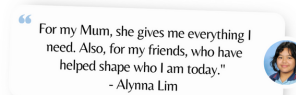
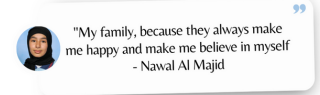
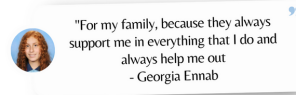
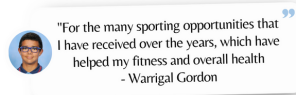
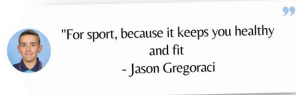
Thank you to you Michelle- here is a poem that summarizes your strength and service to our community
